

This bibliography is actually an "ongoing" project, which I suppose any bibliography should be. It is "select" because it only includes the names of the first six bishops and others who were selected for their role in the early days of the diocese. However, if I left a persons name off this list, one could easily consult any of the books listed in the back for possible information on that person.

The following abbreviations are used:

ACHR - American Catholic Historical Researches (1884-1912). This publication merged with Records of the American Catholic Historical Society of Philadelphia in 1913 (see ACHS). The index covers the period from July 1884 to July 1912 (vols 1-29).

ACHS - Records of the American Catholic Historical Society of Philadelphia. Volume-1 begins in 1884. This publication merged with the American Catholic Historical Researches (ACHR above). The index covers volumes 1-31 (1884-1920). Individual indexes, where found, were checked for each successive volume up to 1983.

CHR - Catholic Historical Review. The journal of the American Catholic Historical Association. This was searched from Volume-1 (1915) to Volume-69 (1983).

USCHS - United States Catholic Historical Society. The journal was call Historical Records and Studies. In 1964 it ceased publication. In 1980 the society began publication of the U.S. Catholic Historian. They also put out a series of monographs which are identified within the USCHS listing with an "M" prior to page numbers. Also, some of the volumes of the journal are in two parts. These are identified with a (pt. #) following the volume number. Thus, (8(pt.1):188) The index for "Records" covers volumes 1-50 which is all that was checked.

ICHR - Illinois Catholic Historical Review. This is the journal of the Illinois Catholic Historical Society which functioned from 1918 till 1929. After July 1929 the journal was passed on to the control of Loyola University at Chicago and renamed "Mid-America" (see below).

WOODSTOCK - Woodstock Letters. These annual volumes were published as a record of current events and historical notes for the Society of Jesus in North and South America. They were published from 1872 until 1969 from Woodstock Maryland.

SLCHR - Saint Louis Catholic Historical Review.  
Published from 1918 through the July issue of 1923.

AmCQR - American Catholic Quarterly Review. Published  
from 1876 through April 1924 (Volume-49). There is a  
general index for volumes 1-25 (January 1876-October  
1900).

Ave Maria - Published by Notre Dame University from  
1865-1968.

MidAm - Mid America Magazine, published quarterly by  
Loyola University. Originally it was devoted to the  
Middle West. Merged with the Illinois Catholic  
Historical Review which was begun in 1918. Volumes began  
in 1929.

CBSJ - Central Blatt and Social Justice. Now known  
simply as the Social Justice Review. Publication began  
in 1908 as the organ of the Catholic Central Verein,  
known for its German-American views.

Historical Bulletin - This was a quarterly publication  
edited by the Jesuits at St. Louis University.  
Publication began in 1922 and it was eventually absorbed  
by Manuscripta in 1957.
